Children will use the books, "The Journal of Iliona – A Young Slave (JC) to write:

- An engaging narrative story, from a refugee's point of view, which includes: figurative language, complex sentences and dialogue to convey characterization and advance the plot.
- A diary excerpt from the point of view of a young slave in Ancient Rome.

Children will plan their writing by:

- identifying the audience for and purpose of the writing, selecting the appropriate form and using other similar writing as models for their own.
- noting and developing initial ideas, drawing on reading and research where necessary.
- using drama and paired talk to rehearse and improve their writing.

Draft and write by:

- selecting appropriate grammar and vocabulary, understanding how such choices can change and enhance meaning.
- in narratives, describing settings, characters and atmosphere.

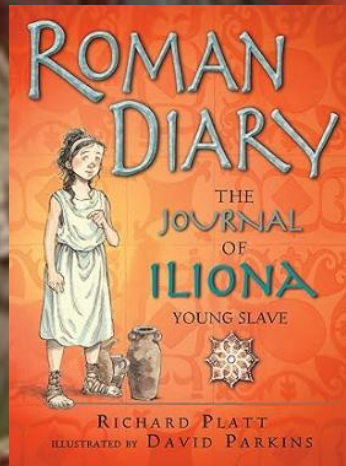

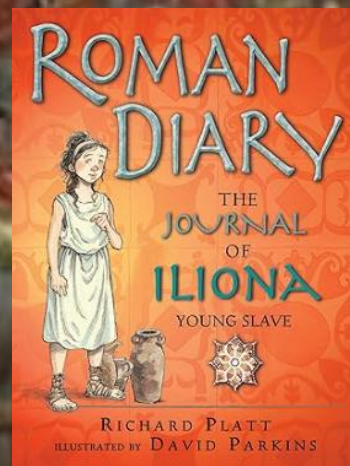
