Swimming in Term 4

Dear Parents and carers,

Swimming will continue for the children in Year 5 and 6 for Term 4.

Lessons will continue to take place on **Thursday afternoons between 1.00pm and 2:30pm for the rest of the term.**

The first lesson starts on Thursday 22nd February with the last session for Term 4 taking place on Thursday 28th March. These lessons will be led by two qualified swimming instructors.

Swimming is only a part of the National Curriculum for KS2; with each KS2 child expected to be able to swim 25 metres by the end of Primary School, Year 6. I am sure as parents and as members of a local seaside community you too understand the need for our children to be water confident.

We want to ensure as many children as possible are able to do this. This is a commitment we want to make as a school, because we feel that water safety is a life skill and particularly required in the area we live. However, we do **rely** on voluntary contributions.

In order for swimming lessons to take place, **we require £3.24 per session or a total of £19.44 for the next 6 sessions.**

Our preference would be for the £19.44 payment to be paid before the end of January.

We are happy to receive instalments of any amount in advance of each weekly swimming lesson.

Any arrears have to be funded by the school at the cost of any other learning resources.

You can pay online via ParentPay (the web based system we currently use to pay for school meals).

On Thursdays, please ensure your children have the following in school:

- **swimming costume/trunks**
- **large towel**
- **hair band for long hair or a swimming cap if preferred.**
- **ALL JEWELLERY MUST BE REMOVED OR SECURED SAFELY.**

All children will be picked up as normal at school at the end of the day.
